In partnership with families and the community, Zion Elementary School District 6 provides pre-K through 8th grade education. The District strives for academic excellence through teaching, empowering, advocating and motivating.

- Funding to support the development of a full-service community schools infrastructure throughout District 6.
- Connections to partners who play key supportive roles.
- Access to valuable resources and services that address Zion elementary students' and their families' specific needs.

Together with our stakeholders, we have:

Advanced the establishment of a the Full-Service Community School model—a nationally recognized strategy for overcoming the barriers of poverty by improving the conditions for learning. This involves ensuring that basic physical, social, emotional and economic needs of the district's 2,500 students and their families are met through partnerships with community agencies.



Mano a Mano Family Resource Center

Mano a Mano empowers immigrants and underserved families through quality programming that educates and links individuals to essential community resources.

The Foundation provides:

- Philanthropic support to launch a feasibility study to evaluate a potential multi-purpose social service and community center in the Round Lake area.
- Capacity-building support, leadership and board development.

Together with our stakeholders, we have:

Expanded programming and services for more than 4,000 predominantly Latino families with very limited English proficiency and an average annual household income of \$20,000.



Lake County Center for Independent Living

The Lake County Center for Independent Living provides advocacy, independent living skills training, peer mentoring and referral services to people with disabilities, empowering them to lead self-directed lives as valued members of the community.

- Funding to elevate the profile of regional mobility planning and expand a coordinated transportation model to the southeast quadrant of Lake County.

Established a leadership role and the resources to lead county and region-wide collaborative work with the potential to positively impact 700,000 residents through reduced congestion and improved and expanded transportation choices.



Affordable Housing Corporation of Lake County

Affordable Housing Corporation of Lake County provides communities and residents with the support to buy homes, improve homes and save homes from foreclosure in Lake County.

The Foundation provides:

- A grant to expand the Neighborhood Transformation project to Mundelein, which provided outreach and education services to families in the community, in addition to home renovations.
- Philanthropic support to leverage federal funds for the establishment of a Lake County Foreclosure Mediation Center.

Together with our stakeholders, we have:

Supported the launch of a Foreclosure Mediation Center in partnership with Lake County government, the courts system, the Lake County Arbitration Center, Prairie State Legal Services and the Center for Conflict Resolution. The center offers comprehensive services to more than 2,000 homebuyers, rehabilitation of more than 200 properties, and education and counseling to more than 10,000 households while reducing case processing time in half.



The Alliance for Human Services

The Alliance for Human Services is a coalition of Lake County organizations and individuals committed to improving the quality of health and human services.

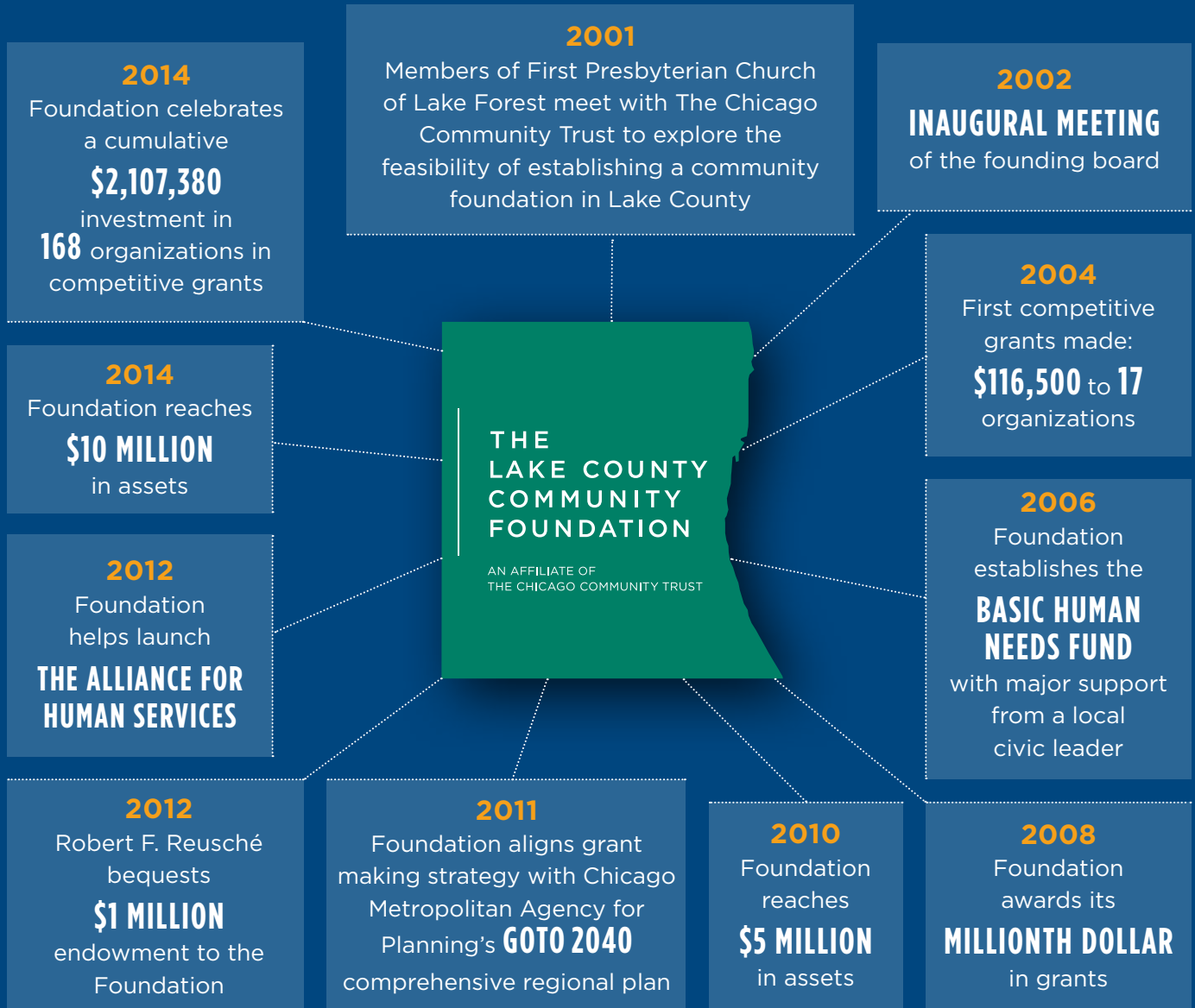
